Juegos Miami initiative brings regulators and operators round a table

'One of the most significant gatherings of gaming thought leaders in the region' is how Greg Saint, Director responsible for Juegos Miami described the Country Round Table initiative, which took centre stage on the opening day of the Miami based event. Created to provide C-Level executives with direct access to government officials, and in the process be best placed to respond to changes in legislation, the initiative featured regulators representing key jurisdictions including Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Dominican Republic, Mexico, Puerto Rico and Uruguay.
